



How-to-Comply for Florida Hazmat Facilities Reporting Chemicals Under Tier Two

The Federal Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA) requires many businesses and government agencies to annually report emergency planning information by March 1st of each year for certain types and amounts of hazardous and toxic chemicals.

Last year as a project, the North Central Florida Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC District 3) reviewed Tier Two Chemical Inventory forms which it received. Suggested corrections may accompany this invitation. The LEPC is providing these **FREE** workshops to explain how to avoid common errors. These compliance assistance workshops are part of outreach efforts during Florida's Hazardous Materials Awareness Week, January 22-28, 2012.
